Jim is making progress and should be able to help us out in the next month.


• Vice President Position

Paul Purdue remined everyone present that we still have the position of Vice President open and asked if there were any interest. None expressed.


Treasury Report

Member Presentations and Show and Tell



Some of the veneer panels Paul purchased on eBay several years ago for \$300. These date from 1920 and earlier. Note the Art Deco influence in some of the designs.



Dave Wanucha illustrated how he imported a photograph of his grandson into an application called Inkscape which allowed him to manipulate the photo into a limited number of tonal values, (upper right). From this he made an outline of the different tonal values as seen in the lower central "paint by numbers diagram". From this outline Dave cut his selection of woods into the marquetry picture shown in the upper right.



Jim Sockwell discusses how he uses the "nape" of the veneer to create contrast even within the same veneer, like green dyed poplar. The idea is to develop contract by presenting the veneer in the setting at various angles to the grain.



Jim Sockwell was inspired by a print which features a Barn with old fashion bee hives. The upright hollow logs in front are bee hives. You cut off the top to harvest and then recap to form a new hive.

Jim was confessing that he used pyrography to add some detail to the tips of the tree. I think it really adds to the sky and tree both.

Jim did this by the packet method and thus has four of these.

He also adds detail by sawing a line, for example to form a crevasse in a rock, and then fills with a dark sawdust in glue.

Dave Wanucha displays two sets of packet cut architectural capitals. The original pattern is in the foreground.

One set has been sand shaded to give the impression of age. They all look terrific Dave.

Tools and Tips:



Charlie Brown demonstrated the utility of a light box for transferring patters to tracing paper which can then be copied for transferring the pattern to the packet /veneer.

The light box was one made by Charlie and uses modern LED light in a tube which generates very little heat.



Charlie Brown explains how an oscillating hole punch is used to punch-out the pupil of the bird at left. The surrounding veneer of the pupil can be cut from the contrasting color then punched to provide a hole for the punched out pupil.
